

RECOMMENDATIONS



1. Review legislative framework and governance arrangements for VET



Enact comprehensive legislation regulating VET for all target groups and providers

Establish participatory multi-level governance arrangements involving public and private sectors and civil society

2. Improve educational planning and rationalise school network



Bring all VET providers under one legal framework

Give vocational schools more autonomy in terms of staff, courses, budgets and partnerships

Improve qualifications, quality assurance and accountability

Develop capacity of school leaders



3. Promote female participation in education and in the labour market



Adopt a joined-up cross-government approach to promoting female participation, particularly for women and girls from rural areas, minorities and other vulnerable groups.



4. Improve youth



Help young people with guidance and professional development

Promote cooperation between vocational schools and businesses to support on-the-job learning

Set up career centres in educational establishments

Embed entrepreneurship and digital skills in curriculum

5. Combine skills training with business support



Establish integrated approaches combining skills training and business support for business start-ups

Promote economic growth through approaches linking education and business in region or value chain

Address issues of business development and business support



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7. Establish upskilling and reskilling pathways for adults



Create more opportunities for adults to develop their skills

Expand basic and vocational skills training courses for adults



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6. Ensure inclusion of all children in quality education to upper secondary level



Expand efforts to include children in both compulsory and upper secondary education

Accelerate move towards a competence-based curricula

Intensify teacher training and provide adequate teaching and learning materials

8. Strengthen work-based learning



Enhance the practice orientation of VET by strengthening school-business collaboration, promoting and regulating company internships and institutionalising the business-liaison function in schools.
