EU Council Recommendation on VET (1)

The Recommendation defines a **vision** for vocational education and training with a **strong focus on digital transformation**.

Principles for the **national level**:

- VET is **agile in adapting** to dynamic labour market changes (e.g. includes digital skills)
- **Flexibility and progression opportunities** (e.g. access to face-to-face, digital or blended learning)
- VET is a driver for **innovation** and **growth preparing for digital and green transitions** (e.g. VET institutions have in place digitalisation strategies)
- VET is attractive and **based** on modern **and digitalised provision of training/skills** (e.g. mix of open, digital and participative learning environments, supported by state-of-the-art and accessible infrastructure, equipment and technology, versatile pedagogies and tools, for example ICT based simulators, virtual and augmented reality; teachers and trainers in VET undertake initial and continuing professional development to foster digital skills and effective innovative training methods, including teaching in virtual environments and digital pedagogy; guidance through digital services and Europass)
- **Equal opportunities**
- VET is underpinned by **quality assurance** (e.g. issue of digital readiness of VET systems and institutions)
- **Effective governance**

EU Council Recommendation on VET (2)

Support actions from the **EU level**:

- **Digitalisation of VET** (e.g. supporting qualitative and effective digitalisation of VET provision in school-based and work-based learning through **European competence frameworks** and **self-assessment tools like SELFIE**; exploring the feasibility of an **EU wide survey for VET schools**; exploring the concept and use of **microcredentials**)
- **Platforms of Centers of Vocational Excellence** (e.g. for local business investment, supporting recovery, green and **digital transitions**, innovation and smart specialisation strategies, developing VET also at higher level)
- **European Vocational Core Profiles** (e.g. exploring these profiles with Member States and stakeholders, as part of **Europass platform** and complemented by **vocational digital content** developed in the framework of European transparency tools)
- **Global reference for skills development** (e.g. by supporting internationalisation of VET systems with EU candidate and European Neighbourhood countries in cooperation with ETF)
- **Strengthened support to apprenticeships** (e.g. through the Digital Skills and Jobs coalition)
- **Peer reviews on quality assurance**

Osnabrück Declaration

- **Complements the VET Recommendation by defining concrete actions for the period 2021-2025 at national and EU level**
- Endorsed by Ministers for VET (EU-27, EEA countries, candidate countries), EU Social Partners and the Commission, supported by EU VET providers' associations and learners' representatives
- **4 objectives:**
 - 1. Resilience and excellence** through quality, inclusive and flexible VET
 - 2. Establishing a new lifelong learning culture** – relevance of C-VET and digitalisation
 - 3. Sustainability** – a green link in VET
 - 4. European Education and Training Area** and international VET

Digital Education Action Plan (2021-2027)

- The updated **Digital Education Action Plan** presents a vision for **improving digital literacy, skills and capacity at all levels of education and training and for all levels of digital skills.**
- It focuses on two priorities:
 - i) Developing a **high-performing digital education ecosystem** and
 - ii) Enhancing **digital competences for the digital transformation.**
- It **supports the digital dimensions of the Council Recommendation on VET.**
- It also **supports the objective of the Skills Agenda** of ensuring that **70% of 16 to 74 year olds should have at least basic digital skills by 2025.**
