



Kev achievements

- Institutional and legal apparatus in place to regulate labour migration
- Bilateral agreements with top destination countries
- Series of international projects, many of which aimed at young migrants

Reasons to migrate:

- Seeking improved economic conditions
- Highly qualified Tunisians abroad have more chance of employment
- Difficult youth transition to the labour market

Possible way forward ratio of tertiary level students:

- More coordinated approach among national stakeholders, donors and international organisations
- Consider migration as a key feature for human capital development policies
- Possible pilot for EU Talent Partnerships
