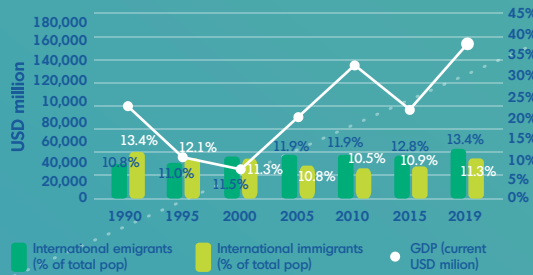

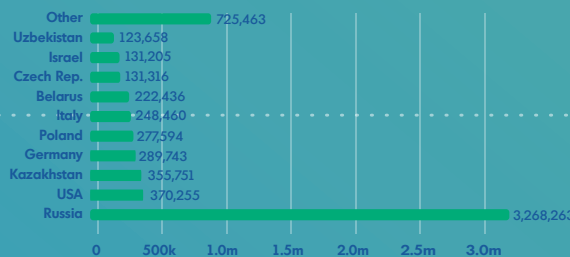
GDP and migration



Reasons to migrate:

- ➔ Worsening economic conditions
- ➔ Labour demand in destination countries
- ➔ Internally Displaced People following illegal annexation of Crimea

- ➔ Development of a national policy framework for migration
- ➔ Labour migration on the political agenda
- ➔ Recognition of professional qualifications and credentials obtained in other countries in place

How can the ETF help?

- ➔ Studies and analyses on skills dimensions of migration, with specific reference to circular migration
- ➔ Pilot in comparing the Ukrainian national qualifications framework with the European Qualifications Framework

Possible way forward

- ➔ Support the reintegration of returning migrants through skills recognition and better access to national labour market
- ➔ Capture the skills dimension of migration in data collection
- ➔ Explore opportunities offered by the EU Talent Partnerships
