

Key achievements

- Development of a national policy framework for migration
- → Labour migration on the political agenda
- Recognition of professional qualifications and credentials obtained in other countries in place

Possible way forward

- Support the reintegration of returning migrants through skills recognition and better access to national labour market
- Capture the skills dimension of migration in data collection
- Explore opportunities offered by the EU Talent Partnerships

Reasons to migrate:

- Worsening economic conditions
- Labour demand in destination countries
- Internally Displaced People following illegal annexation of Crimea
