## Harnessing youth employability in the Western Balkans Validation of non-formal and informal learning and its relevance for Youth Guarantee schemes

## INTRODUCTION

On 8 July 2021, the Western Balkans high level representatives endorsed the *Declaration on ensuring* sustainable labour market integration of young people, a commitment to establish, implement and consolidate Youth Guarantee schemes, taking inspiration from the Council Recommendation (2020) on A Bridge to Jobs – Reinforcing the Youth Guarantee. Western Balkans authorities are invited to develop, in consultation with employment, education and youth stakeholders, and adopt Youth Guarantee Implementation Plans by June 2022. The main objective of YGIPs is to gradually secure all young people under 30 years of age receive a good quality offer of employment, continued education, an apprenticeship or a traineeship within a period of four months of becoming unemployed or leaving formal education.

The European Commission jointly with the International Labour Organization and the European Training Foundation (ETF) provide technical assistance to the Western Balkans stakeholders to identify the key challenges and policy solutions, and to create opportunities for cross-country learning and exchanges. In this context, the European Training Foundation runs a series of events focused on skills development dimensions of Youth Guarantee schemes. Validation of non-formal and informal learning (VNFIL) is recommended in both preparatory phase and delivery of Youth Guarantee offers to young people not in employment, education or training.

The main objective of this meeting is to discuss the relevance of VNFIL for design and implementation of Youth Guarantee schemes in the Western Balkans, and the conditions that have to be met to gain synergies between qualification systems reform and the active labour market programmes. The meeting will include a review of the state of play in the region with regard to VNFIL developments, challenges and priorities for the future. The ETF will facilitate an exchange of illustrative practices on how VNFIL measures can support swift labour market integration for various categories of beneficiaries, including young people.

The working languages of the event are English and the languages of the region. The event will take place in an online format.
