


WHO ARE THE GLAD ACTORS?

Policy design, setting the reform priorities....




Civil Society Organizations (CSOs)

Advocacy and service provision, close to citizens




Researches and academics



Examples	<p>Learning: via workshops and high-level webinars, peer learning</p> <p>Discuss the thematic issues of interest for 2 or more countries, e.g. through discussion of Inventory results (May/June 2022)</p>	<p>Action: via implementing an innovative practice, or action research</p> <p>Co-creation of solutions for governance mechanisms: CSOs engagement in policy dialogue (September/October)</p>	<p>Dialogue: shaping a new mechanism through multi-stakeholder engagement, on a country or multi-country basis</p> <p>Recent examples: PPPs and its application to the Youth Guarantee (done 1 March, 2022)</p>
