In partnership with the ILO, ETF developed a report in 2021 on developing and enhancing career development support systems. In 2021/22 the ETF conducted reviews of national career development support systems in all Western Balkan countries aiming at collecting facts and information about existing policy and practice. The reviews cover lifelong career guidance for all, career education, career development support for workers, including for non-standard forms of employment, to inform national policy discussions and national/regional EU programmes, such as Youth Guarantee implementation plan development and IPA III programming. For Montenegro, a national expert was recruited by ETF to draft the review.

After a longer consultation process that led to the development of the review report, the European Training Foundation (ETF) is pleased to invite you to a second meeting in the framework of the review in Montenegro.

The meeting aims at discussing priorities for the country to further enhance the system and ways to move forward in those priority areas.
