SUMMARY

Within the ETF Network for Excellence, **GRETA** – **G**reening **R**esponses to **E**xcellence through **T**hematic **A**ctions supports CoVEs in their greening processes.

GRETA promotes knowledge sharing, peer learning and collaboration of **CoVEs and VET providers** with a view to support their provision of green skills – and is implemented in collaboration with the Danish Technological Institute (DTI).

GRETAs **whole institutional framework** sets methodological frame for greening of VET around **five dimensions**: 1) Strategies for going green 2) Providing green skills throughout the curriculum 3) Enabling teachers and trainers to promote green skills 4) Collaborating on green initiatives with outside stakeholders 5) Funding green initiatives.

In December 2022 CoVEs from Armenia, Georgia, Latvia, Serbia, Slovenia, Spain, Turkey and Ukraine joined GRETA. For more information about GRETA, please visit GRETA's Open Space page.



In the current, 2nd phase of GRETA, **six online Thematic Webinars** are organised from **June – January 2023** aiming to present and share good practices to both the active participants of GRETA as well as other members of ENE.

The first Thematic session organised 1 June, focussed on **teachers training and continuing professional development** as this is a key enabler to excel in the greening of VET.

This **second Thematic session takes place 30 June**, and will look into practices and funding possibilities for **green international partnerships**. These partnerships, that can involve schools, businesses, NGOs or other types of stakeholders in different countries, play a vital role in **fostering the creation**, **dissemination and application of knowledge** that is needed to support the **greening efforts of VET providers**.

Collaboration in international partnerships not only allows for **mutual inspiration**, but also entails the opportunity for **green co-creation**, for example in terms of what green skills to address within a given training program and how to do so. Whilst it is clear that participation in such partnerships requires resources, they are typically of great strategic value with benefits for all partners involved.

Key take-aways from the second Thematic session in GRETA:

- ⇒ Knowledge on what international partnerships involving CoVEs are and how they function.
- ⇒ Information on funding possibilities for international partnerships.
- ⇒ Inspiration from CoVEs and specific green projects benefitting from international partnerships.
