## CIVIL SOCIETY ORGANISATIONS (CSOS) AND HUMAN CAPITAL DEVELOPMENT IN THE CONTEXT OF LIFELONG LEARNING

HYBRID MEETING

18 OCTOBER 2022, 09.00 CEST

## **SUMMARY**

In 2020-2021, the ETF carried out a study on the role of Civil Society Organisations (CSOs) as crucial actors in human capital development (HCD) and lifelong learning (LLL), in 6 countries. By exploring the CSOs scope of work, whom they address and with whom they cooperate in the field of non-formal and informal learning and support to employment, the study fostered the understanding of the patterns of their engagement in HCD and LLL. The study highlighted the CSOs' resilience notably their aptitude to learn and grow in disruptive situations such as pandemics.

The ETF also assessed the tools that CSOs and CSOs networks use to achieve impact. Among the most effective tools there were: participatory methods, advocacy, learning from practice to influence policymaking, analysis of individuals' needs, developing people's key competencies, knowledge of specific contexts, collecting evidence about the impact of public policies.

Gathering over 40 European networks in education and training, the Lifelong Learning Platform is the widest network of EU CSOs engaged in formal, non-formal and informal learning. Currently these networks represent more than 50 000 educational institutions and associations covering all sectors of formal, non-formal and informal learning. Their members reach out to several millions of beneficiaries.

Recognising the critical advantage of associating and networking in order to strengthen the effective contribution of civil society to the design and implementation of policies in the field of formal, non-formal, informal education and training that enable people's access no matter their age, status, geographical location, the ETF and LLLP are organising this workshop in cooperation.



**Objective:** Building on the knowledge and experience of the ETF, CSOs international networks and individual CSOs, the workshop aims to:

- discuss what is currently done and can be recommended in future to recognise CSOs as relevant actors in LLL and LLL-related policy processes, at country and international level;
- identify feasible approaches to CSOs networking, as one means to engage in LLL and develop people's human capital. On its part, the ETF will open for Governance, Learning, Action and Dialogue (GLAD) cooperation with CSOs and CSOs networks.

**Participants:** the ETF-LLLP joint workshop is open to the contributions of CSOs from partner countries and EU-wide networks including the EAEA and Solidar Foundation, as well as governmental representatives and EU institutions.

**Venue:** The meeting will take place in **presence at the ETF in Turin** and **online**. Interpretation in English, French and Russian will be provided.
