INTRODUCTION

The European Training Foundation is organising a workshop on evidence consolidation and use in the fields of active labour market policies and transition to work, with focus on skills dimensions.

In 2022, the ETF has launched a multiannual initiative with two objectives (i) to capture developments in areas of active labour market policies (ALMPs) and transition to work, in particular skills implications, and (ii) to enhance sharing of innovative policy solutions, and support improvement in employability and skills sets in a lifelong learning approach. The work includes reviews of activation, reskilling and upskilling policies and programmes; fostering policy learning and exchange among ETF partner countries and EU Member States, as well as regular collection and expansion of datasets on ALMPs and other related aspects. With this initiative, ETF seeks to consolidate thematic knowledge and evidence, as well as performance and innovation based decision making in policy areas critical for the achievement of UN Sustainable Development Goals and principles set out in the European Pillar of Social Rights.

Key topics of the event are:

- overview of ALMP statistics availability in the EU neighbouring countries, measurement approaches, results and key challenges;
- countries' experiences and practices concerning expansion of ALMPs evidence, monitoring and evaluation, with focus on ETF Partner Countries and EU Member States;
- updates on the work in the fields of skills and youth transition, in particular skills mismatch; youth transition; and the European Skills and Jobs Survey;
- recent developments at the European level in the field of labour statistics, and future surveys and data collection initiatives.

The event is open to participants from all ETF partner counties: ministerial and public employment service's officials, as well as representatives of statistical offices with the aim at providing them with mutual learning and experience sharing opportunities; as well as updates concerning latest developments at EU and international level.
