Buildings currently contribute to nearly 40% of global energy-related carbon emissions. Within this, almost 30% stems from operational emissions, which are generated from the energy required to heat, cool, and power buildings. The remaining 10% of emissions originate from materials and construction processes.

It is evident that urgent action is needed! - And a **skilled workforce is vital** for innovation and emission reduction.

We will explore the adoption of **sustainable materials and innovative technologies**, along with a deep dive into examples of **occupational standards and green VET programmes** for the construction sector.
