European Quality of Life Surveys (EQLS)


The EQLS provides a comprehensive portrait of living conditions in European countries. It contains a broad range of indicators on different dimensions of quality of life, both objective and subjective.

Working conditions – Digitisation, automation and Al






Job tasks revisited

- How do we know what people do at work?
- Eurofound & JRC research job tasks:
 - task content (what you do), methods (work organisation), tools (digital, mechanical)
- New data: 2022 EU Labour Force Survey module on "job skills" (tasks)
 - Frequency of **manual** tasks (strength, dexterity)
 - Frequency of **cognitive** tasks (reading, calculating)
 - Frequency of **communication** tasks (with people inside and outside the organisation)
 - Frequency of use of digital devices
 - Extent of routine (repetitiveness, standardisation)
 - Extent of autonomy (order and content of tasks)
 - EU-27, 450,000 respondents



Job tasks: variation between occupation and countries

Average task indices for ISCO 1-digit occupations



Task indices vary by occupation (by construction), along the ISCO hierarchy, and sector

They also vary substantially by demographics:

- Education level
- Income
- Gender

And structural factors:

- Firm size
- Country




How different is the same job across countries?

Take same occupations: office clerks (ISCO 411)

- In SE, 94% say that they use **digital devices** "at least half of the time" in job; EL: 61%
- In SE, 55% say that they have "high autonomy" in the order of tasks; in EL, 4.2%

How different is the same job across countries?

Task intensity, compared to what national occupational structure would predict





Forthcoming relevant research at Eurofound

- Forthcoming results from EU Labour Force Survey module on "job skills" (tasks):
 - country variation in task profiles
 - skill utilisation
- Forthcoming results of European Working Conditions Survey 2024 (EWC, resultscoming 2025H2) include some variables on the worker exposure to and use of digital and AI tools.
- On-going survey of **online platform workers** that carry out their tasks online (with European Labour Authority)
- On-going 2025 project 'AI (and AI-enabling) technologies for work management'
- Pilot project for DG EMPL: 'Productivity, employment, and wages in the age of AI methodologies and impacts'



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
