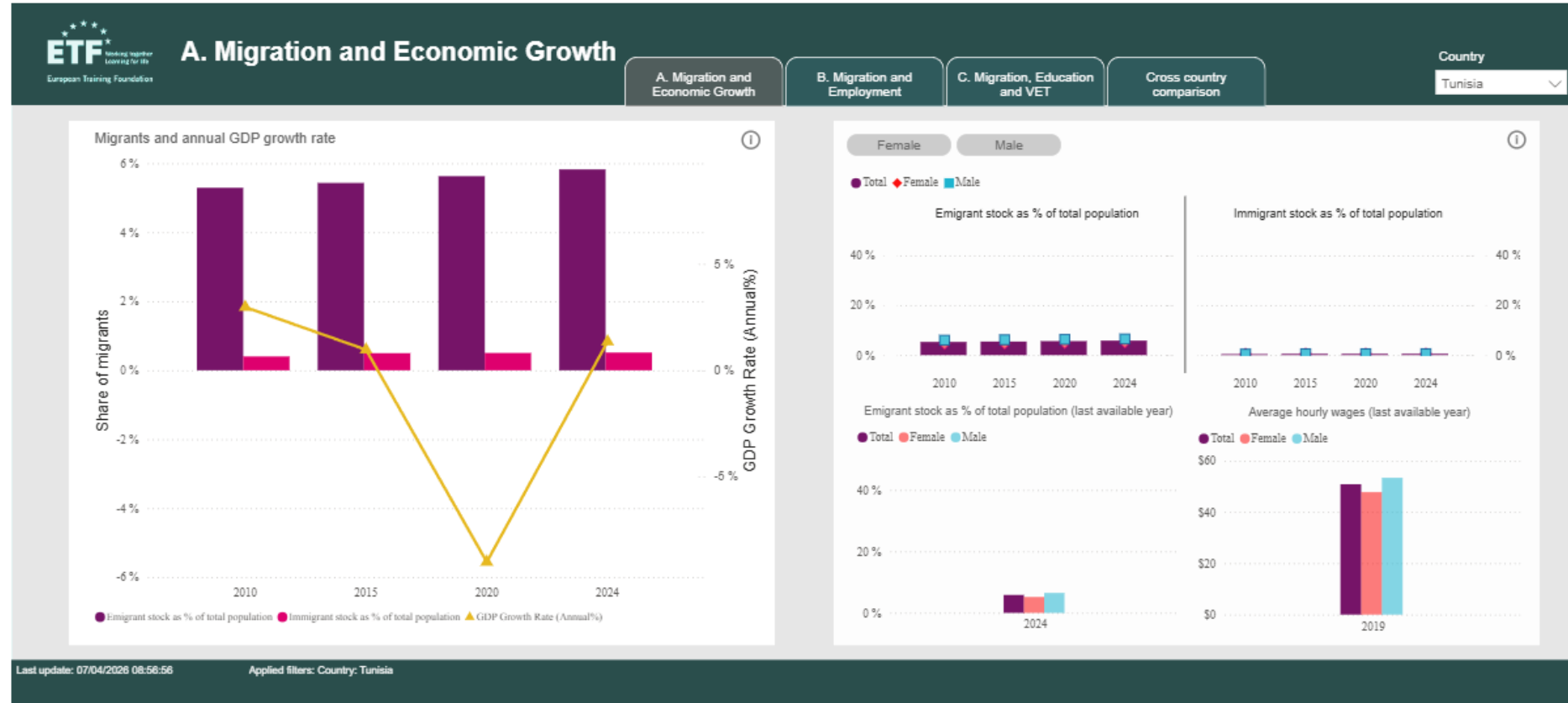

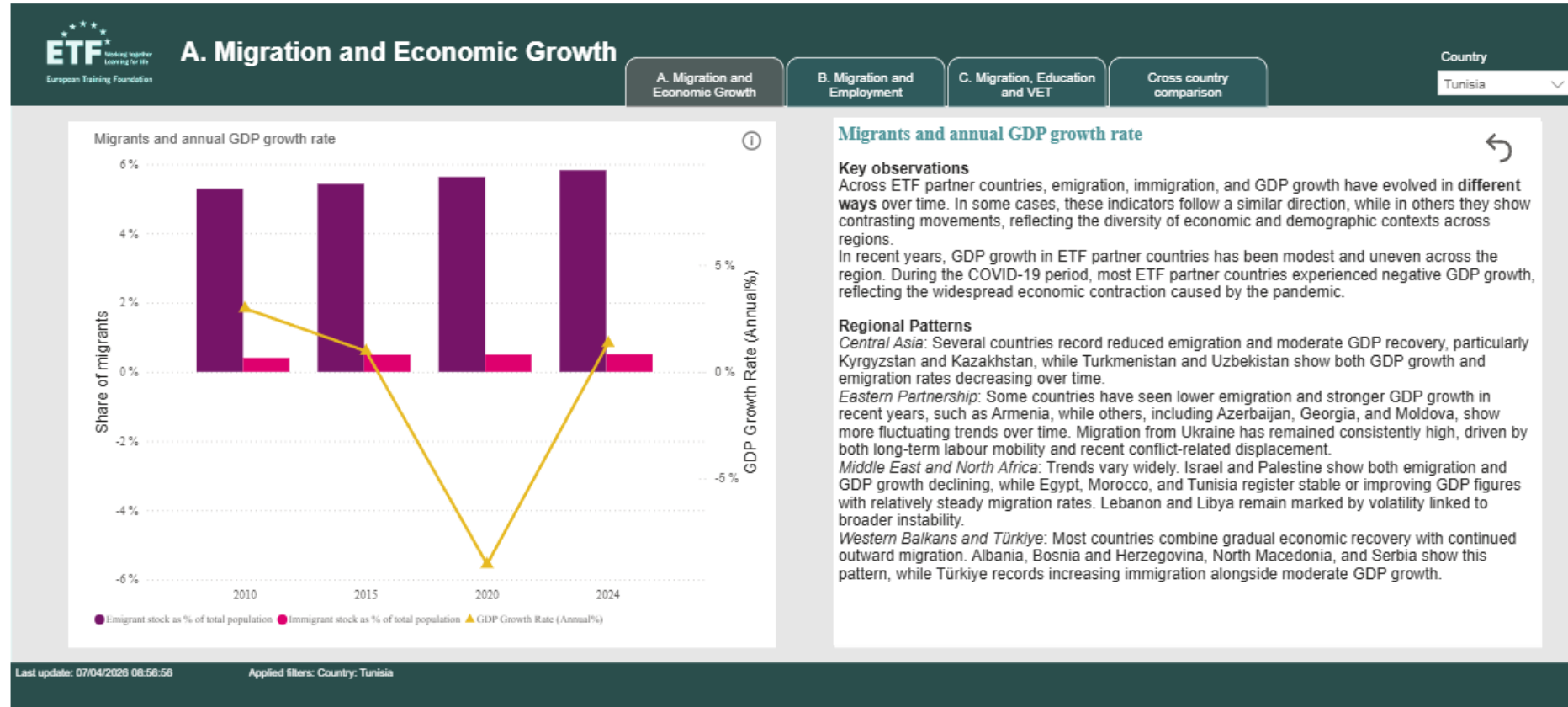

# Migration Dashboard

# Thematic areas

Three main areas of focus:

1. Migration and **Economic Growth**

2. Migration and **Employment**

3. Migration, **Education and Vocational Training**

Each thematic area is structured into sub-areas, and key findings are summarised to reflect **regional trends and patterns**.

Data on **female** migration have been mainstreamed across the different dimensions.

# 1. Migration and Economic Growth

## Migration & GDP growth rate

*Emigration stock as % of total population, immigrant stock as % of total population, GDP growth rate (annual %)*

- Different patterns of evolution, marked by negative GDP growth in 2020
- SEET: highest and increasing emigration shares
- SEMED: highest immigration shares

## Migrants by Sex

Female migration broadly follows overall migration trends

Female immigration shares are slightly higher than total overall

## Emigration & Wages

Mixed pattern across countries

High emigration shares can be observed at different wage levels

## 2. Migration and Employment

### Residence Permits in EU

↑ Permits for both education and employment  
Employment permits rising faster (post-2020)  
Highest volumes in SEET (e.g. SRB, BIH)

### Labour Market & Emigration

Mixed patterns across ETF  
Some regions: ↓ unemployment + ↓ emigration  
Others: emigration persists despite improving labour markets

### Employment Rates (Migrants in OECD)

Migrant employment < OECD average  
There are gender gaps (e.g. Morocco, Egypt)

# 3. Migration, Education and Vocational Training

## Education Spending & Emigration

SEET: high emigration despite moderate investment  
Central Asia: higher spending and lower emigration

## Student Mobility

Outbound mobility > inbound in most countries  
Some emerging countries (e.g. Georgia, Kyrgyzstan)

## VET & Emigration

High emigration can coexist with strong VET employment  
Mixed outcomes across countries

## Educational Attainment (Migrants in OECD)

Strong variation in skill levels across countries  
Relatively higher share of high-skilled migrants in most of SEMED
