SUMMARY

The Torino Process is an evidence-informed analysis of Human Capital Development issues and Vocational Education and Training policies responses in the ETF partner countries. The process, launched by the ETF for the first time in 2010, is now in its fifth round of implementation in 2019-2020.

Under the leadership of the Ministry of Education and Science (MoES), this round of the Torino Process has been implemented with participation of all regions in Ukraine. With the MoES decree a Torino Process working group was formally established to involve relevant key institutions for the implementation at both national and regional level.

Following the preparation of the national and regional reports, this meeting will have as primary objective to present and discuss key findings and recommendations as main outcomes of the process.

Specific objectives of the workshop are the following:

- Share with participants the state of progress and key findings of the national and regional reports
- Discuss the key issues and recommendations of the ETF assessment
- Identify specific actions to address the recommendations (both short quick-wins and long-term actions)





The expected outcome is an agreed set of concrete strategic action-oriented recommendations.

The event forms part of the European Vocational Skills Week, which showcases vocational education and training; and vocational skills through a series of events, exhibitions and other initiatives across Europe.
