Title of the event: Torino process 2018-2020 launch event in the Republic of Azerbaijan
Venue: Baku (Hotel Hilton)
Date: 27 February 2019

SUMMARY

The Torino Process is an evidence-informed analysis of Human Capital Development issues and VET policies responses in the ETF partner countries. The process, launched by the ETF for the first time in 2010, enters in its fifth round of implementation that will be completed in the period 2019-2020.

The Republic of Azerbaijan participated in the Torino process since 2010. In 2018-2020 cycle, full ownership of the Torino process is with the national key stakeholders. Human Capital Development, covering Education, Training, skills and Life-Long Learning touches upon a number of policy domains. In this context, in Azerbaijan, the role of VET, becomes very important, as it has impact on the implementation of high level objectives for growth and sustainable development. In 2019 the idea is to start from this high level of ownership to further improve the scope and usefulness of the Torino Process.

The objectives of this first workshop are the following:

- To get familiar with the Torino Process 2018-2020 objectives and strategic orientations;
- To present and familiarise with the Torino Process National Reporting Framework - NRF (framework of analysis) and clarify any questions on the NRF
- To present the ETF assessment





- To discuss and agree on policy added value of Torino Process in the country and define/confirm the calendar of implementation
- To present and discuss the Torino Process indicators, see if there are any gaps and how to collect additional information
- To discuss and agree on relevant key stakeholders to be involved in the preparation and consultations on the National Reporting Framework
