## FINANCING OF VET SCHOOLS IN MONTENEGRO – PEER LEARNING WORKSHOP

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### PRESENTATION

At the request of the Ministry of Education of Montenegro, the European Training Foundation (ETF) planned in 2019 a support to the national strategic reflection on financing modalities for Vocational Education and Training (VET) schools in Montenegro. Consequently, it was agreed that first, the ETF would carry out a thorough analysis of the VET financing system currently in place. Based on its findings, a peer learning workshop is organised with the triple objective to:

- (i) share the main findings of this state of play,
- (ii) expose the Montenegrin stakeholders involved in the financing of VET schools to international experiences and look into their applicability, namely those of Estonia and Slovenia, thanks to the participation of practitioners from these two European Union Member States,
- (iii) discuss needs and identify possible next steps for reforming the financing of VET schools in Montenegro
