



COOPERATION AGREEMENT

and

hereinafter referred to as "IIAS"

INTRODUCTION

Having regard the Regulation (EC) No 1339/2008 establishing the European Training Foundation as an agency of the European Union, aiming to contribute, in the context of EU external relations policies, to improving human capital development in the partner countries;

Whereas the 'human capital development' is defined as work which contributes to the lifelong development of individuals' skills and competences through the improvement of vocational education and training systems;

Whereas amongst the ETF functions there are to facilitate the exchange of information and experience among donors engaged in human capital development reform in partner countries, and to disseminate information and encourage networking and the exchange of experience and good practice between the EU and partner countries and amongst partner countries in human capital development issues;

Noting ETF's decision to strengthen the exchange of experiences, peer learning and access to information between partner countries and the EU Member states;

Whereas the Institute of Administrative Science includes the European Group for Public Administration (EGPA), bringing together European academics and practitioners and their research institutions. Its purpose is to develop public administration contingent on the European environment, to foster comparative studies and the development of administrative theory within a European perspective, to facilitate the application of corresponding innovative ideas and technologies, to organize and encourage an exchange of information relative to developments in the theory and practice of public administration, to stimulate and promote participation of young professionals in its activities and to set up appropriate permanent or occasional networks related to common research interests amongst European professionals both academic and practitioners active in the field of public administration.

Considering the full respect of responsibilities of each Side in their field of expertise;

Recognising that the Sides have a common interest in cooperation in the field of human capital development

THE SIDES HAVE DECIDED AS FOLLOWS:

1 – PURPOSE

- 1.1 This Cooperation Agreement establishes a framework for co-operation in the field of public policies management between the ETF and the IIAS/EGPA.
- 1.2 This Cooperation Agreement is not intended to create or affect legal rights or obligations, either in the relationship between the ETF and the IIAS/EGPA or with thirds, but is a statement of best intent.

2 – COOPERATION OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

- 2.1 The general objectives of this cooperation will be to promote the improvement of public policies performance in the ETF partner countries.
- 2.1 Cooperation will be pursued by means of the activities described in Annex I, which forms integral part of this Cooperation Agreement.

3 – IMPLEMENTATION

- 3.1 Co-operation under this agreement will be conducted on the basis of the following principles:
 - a) Appointment of contact points to coordinate the co-operation as provided in Annex I;
 - b) Joint and regular planning of the decided activities;
 - c) Review of the implementation, including discussion of possible difficulties and improvements;
 - d) Information-sharing on recent developments, policies, new practices in the field of public policies performance in education, training and employment.
- 3.2 Each Side will endeavor to prevent any situation that could compromise the impartial and objective implementation of this Cooperation Agreement. Such conflict of interest could arise in particular as a result of economic interest, political or national affinity, family or emotional ties or any other relevant connection or shared interest.
- 3.3 Each Side will undertake with the scope of avoiding any conflict of interest, to refrain from participating in procurement procedures launched by the other Side

4 – FINANCIAL PROVISIONS

- 4.1 All cooperation will be carried out within the administrative and financial rules and regulations of both Sides and in line with the mandate and responsibilities of the Sides.

5 – MONITORING AND EVALUATION

Co-operation will be monitored and evaluated as appropriate on a mutual cooperative basis thus permitting, as necessary, the adjustment of the decided activities in the light of any needs or opportunities becoming apparent in the course of their implementation.

6 – COPYRIGHT AND OWNERSHIP

- 6.1 Copyright on the content of all texts and other documents produced under this co-operation will vest jointly in the Sides.
- 6.2 The Sides will not divulge such documents and information referred to in Section 6.1 above without the written consent of the other.

7 – VISIBILITY

- 7.1 Each Side will endeavor to take the appropriate measures to ensure that communications or publications about the joint activities, including at an event, indicate that they have received contributions from the Sides.



8 – OTHER ARRANGEMENTS
