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SKILLS FOR THE FUTURE: MANAGING TRANSITION

21-22 NOVEMBER 2018 - TURIN, ITALY

The **European Training Foundation (ETF)** is organising a conference in Turin on 21-22 November 2018, entitled ***Skills for the future: managing transition*** to explore how developing and transition countries can respond to the challenges of current global trends from a skills perspective. How do global forces interact with local realities and how does this affect the need for skills? How should governments, businesses, social partners, civil society, research institutions, communities and education and training providers work together to manage change? What skills policies work in different contexts?

LOCATION: built in 1895, the OGR – Officine Grandi Riparazioni used to be the largest industrial facility in Turin. It was recently reconverted into an arts centre with exhibition halls, restaurants and conference rooms. It is integrated within the new campus of Turin Polytechnic.

PARTICIPANTS: over 200 representatives from the EU and its neighbouring countries from government, industry, research community and civil society, the European Commission, international organisations and practitioners in the field of skills development. The first part of the event will be open to a wider public.

SPEAKERS: high level speakers from government, industry, the research community and civil society, the European Commission, international organisations and practitioners in the field of skills development will stimulate the discussion.

EXPERIENCE PATH: the experience path will offer participants the opportunity to visit different stands where our partners will showcase inspirational projects and activities around the key themes of skills, transition and the future.

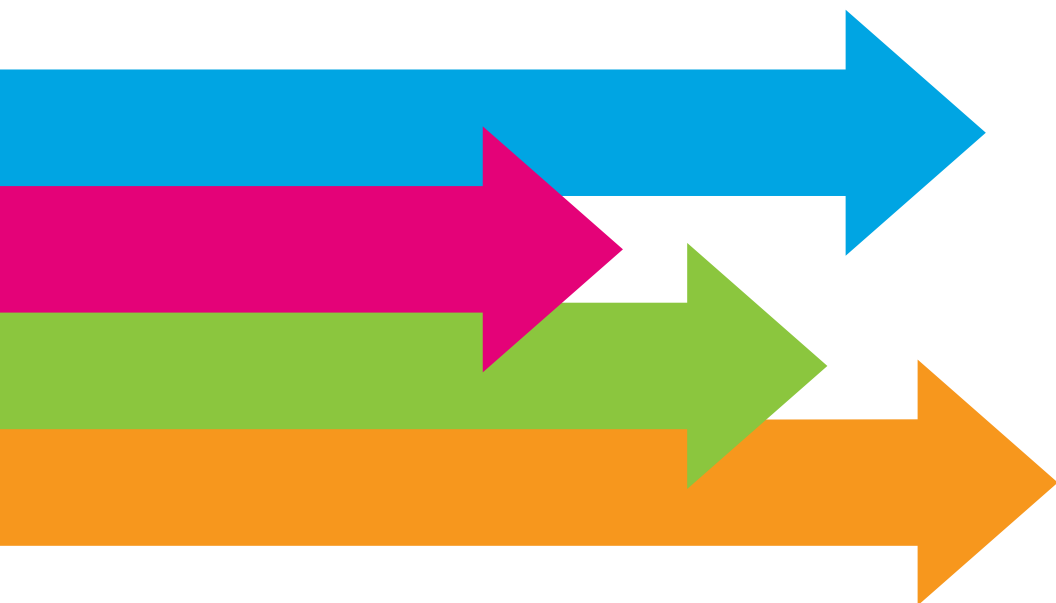
