SUMMARY¹

Inspired by the European Union Copenhagen-Bruges Process, the Torino Process is an evidence-informed analysis of human capital development issues and vocational **education and training (VET) policy responses**. The process, launched by the ETF for the first time in 2010, aims to be a vehicle for policy development forging a shared understanding of a medium-term vision, priorities and progress in the field of skills development. Following the preparation of sub-national reports and the national report, based on the National Reporting Framework, this event will have the primary objective to present and disseminate key findings and recommendations, representing the main outcomes of the process. The expected outcome is an agreed set of strategic and concrete action-oriented recommendations.

¹ To put vocational education and training extra in the spotlights, this event takes place under the umbrella of the EU VET Skills Week. This is an initiative of the European Commission to promote vocational education and training throughout Europe with a series of activities.
