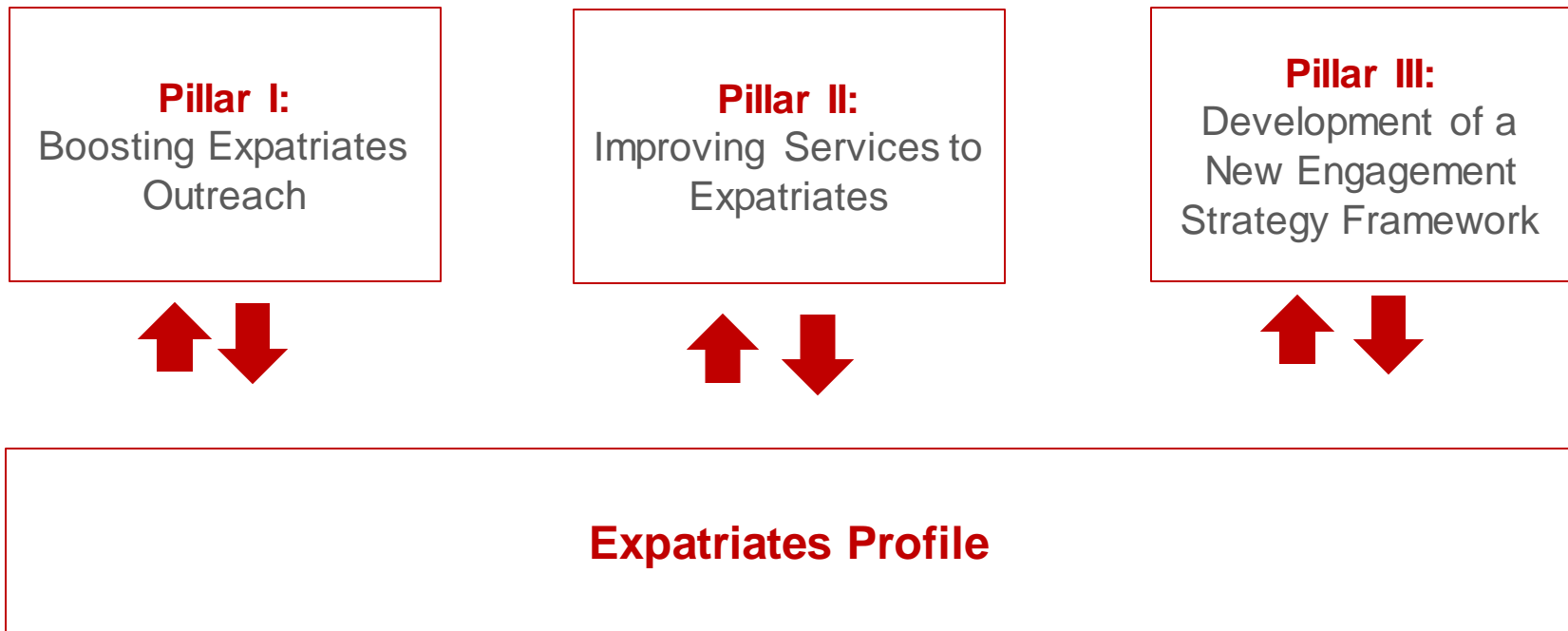
EU-Jordan Mobility Partnership: Signed Oct. 2014

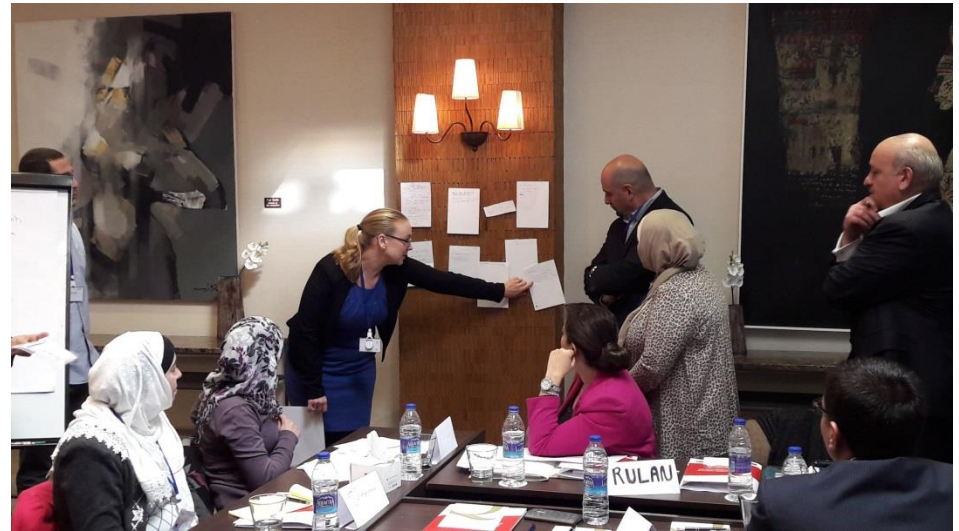
